 - Workshop (1-2 hours, hands-on)
- Lightning Round Session (10- minute presentation followed by facilitated group discussion)

Presentation titles should not exceed ten words. Only one abstract submission per person, but a presenter may appear as a co-author (but not the first author) on other submitted abstracts. An author may also submit another proposal in an additional category (e.g., a poster or a workshop).
