Communities*

How can language resource centers and language faculty help students recognize that learning a language gives them access to and membership in a wider community?

invites conference proposals that discuss projects, ideas, and initiatives that leverage learning technologies to engage students in Language Learning Communities in the following formats:

- **30 Minute individual/Group Presentation**
- **Roundtable Discussion or Panel (30 minutes, maximum of 3 presenters +15 min Q & A)**
- **(Electronic) Poster Session**
- **Workshop (1-2 hours, hands-on)**
- **Lightning Round Session (10- minute presentation followed by facilitated group discussion)**

Presentation titles should not exceed ten words. Only one abstract submission per person, but a presenter may appear as a co-author (but not the first author) on other submitted abstracts. An author may also submit another proposal in an additional category (e.g., a poster or a workshop).
